Course Aims

By the end of this course, students will know the following:

After 4 weeks students would be expected to reach an "early A1" survival level, enough to manage very simple conversations if the other person speaks slowly and clearly.

Learning Objectives

Our 4-week beginner Spanish "Boost" courses are designed as a fast-track introduction to practical, real-world Spanish at CEFR A1 level.

Their main purpose is to help complete beginners quickly gain enough Spanish to:

- introduce themselves
- handle simple everyday conversations
- understand and use common phrases
- build confidence speaking from day one
- develop the four core skills: listening, speaking, reading, and writing

The method is strongly communicative, meaning the focus is on using Spanish in realistic situations rather than memorising grammar in isolation.

A typical 4-week "Boost" version would compress the early A1 content into an intensive short course. That usually includes:

- greetings and introductions
- nationality, jobs, personal information
- numbers, dates, and basic questions
- basic present tense verbs
- pronunciation and listening practice
- talking about family and hobbies
- ordering food and drinks
- expressing likes/dislikes
- present tense verbs (irregulars)
- pronunciation and listening practice

The broader educational purpose of both courses is to:

- prepare students for a longer A1 course,
- refresh rusty beginners or starting from scratch,
- build some confidence before travel,
- help learners decide whether to continue studying Spanish.

Our courses also emphasise:

- interaction in class,
- pair/group speaking activities,
- Hispanic culture,
- and learner autonomy (continuing study outside class).
